Metropolitan Saba's Letter Concerning Diocesan Oversight Assignments

(Abridged and edited by Fr. Paul O'Callaghan)

Venerable Hierarchs, Reverend Clergy, and Christ-loving Faithful of our Archdiocese,

Since my arrival as your Metropolitan, I have been concerned that two dioceses of our vast archdiocese are without a bishop to oversee them: Los Angeles and the West, and Wichita and Mid-America. Although we are not yet ready for an election of new bishops, I want to ensure that these dioceses have the attention and care they need.

Thus I am assigning the Rt. Rev. Calinic (Berger) as Archiepiscopal Vicar for the Diocese of Wichita and Mid-America, after elevating him to the rank and dignity of Archimandrite on the Feast of the Ascension. I have asked His Grace Bishop Anthony—who has served well and faithfully for many years—to move to Los Angeles and serve as Bishop in the West. We are grateful that he has taken this diocese's needs to heart and accepted this assignment. Additionally, I am assigning the Rt. Rev. Archimandrite Jeremy (Davis) as Archiepiscopal Vicar for the Diocese of Toledo and the Midwest. Finally, I am assigning the Rt. Rev. Archimandrite Paul (Matar) as Archiepiscopal Vicar for the Diocese of New York and Washington, D.C., so that these parishes can have special care and attention so I can focus on Archdiocesan matters. All these assignments will be effective August 1, 2024.

The holy apostle Paul has instructed us that "all things should be done decently and in order" (1 Cor. 14:40). Just as we rely on our priests to ensure that their parishes function harmoniously in this way, so do we rely on our bishops—and now our archiepiscopal vicars—to lead their dioceses toward the same goal. In this light, I have full confidence in His Grace Bishop Anthony, Archimandrite Jeremy, Archimandrite Paul, and Archimandrite Calinic as they embark on these new ministries. We hope that, with God's help and everyone's cooperation and goodwill, these plans will prove to be fruitful for the future of our God-protected Archdiocese.

Wishing you much joy as we celebrate Holy Pentecost, I remain,



FR. CALINIC ELEVATED TO THE RANK OF ARCHIMANDRITE

Appointed Archiepiscopal Vicar for the Diocese of Wichita

On the Feast of the Glorious Ascension of Christ, June 13, 2024, Metropolitan Saba elevated Fr. Calinic Berger to the rank of "archimandrite" at the DOWAMA Parish Life Conference in Beaumont, TX. Axios! He is worthy!

The title "archimandrite" originally referred to a superior abbot whom a bishop appointed to su-

pervise several lesser abbots and monasteries, or as the abbot of some especially great and important monastery.

In the present usage, "archimandrite" is most often used purely as a title of honor with



no connection to any actual monastery. It is bestowed on a hieromonk as a mark of respect or gratitude for exceptional service to the Church. This title is only given to those priests who have been tonsured monks, while distinguished nonmonastic (typically married) priests would be given the title of archpriest. Because it is a monastic bestowal with the assumption of celibacy, an archimandrite always outranks an archpriest (see 1 Corinthians 7:1,8,32-33).

The role of Archimandrite Calinic as "Archiepiscopal Vicar" is outlined in Metropolitan Saba's letter (which see). Due to this appointment, Fr. Calinic will no longer be on staff at St. George Cathedral, but will be in the employ of the Archdiocese under the direct supervision of Metropolitan Saba as of August 1.

This transfer of responsibility from the parish to the Diocese has several important ramifications that all parishioners should be aware of, to wit:

- Fr. Calinic will only perform liturgical services at the Cathedral on an occasional basis; he will be visiting other parishes regularly, much as Bishop Basil did in the past.
- He will not maintain an office at the Cathedral. His office will be at the Wichita Chancery.
- He will no longer perform typical pastoral duties, such as shut-in visitations, pre-marital counseling, etc.
- He will only participate in baptisms, weddings, and funerals upon request from the family through Fr. Paul.
- He will not conduct confessions at the Cathedral. He will only confess his spiritual children at the Chancery Chapel; all others will revert to Fr. Paul as confessor.
- He will not regularly lead SOYO discussions, do Adult Education presentations or teaching series, though he may do so occasionally upon request.

Cathedral parishioners should thus recognize that the scope Fr. Cal's responsibilities and duties has changed, and respect his new role, not expecting him to fulfill parochial duties as in the past.



We earnestly pray that our good

God will bless and prosper Fr. Calinic in his new ministry, that he may by the grace of God bring forth much fruit for His kingdom!

- Jesus' healing of the demon-possessed men, gives us a perfect look into the heart of prison ministry. These men were "so fierce that no one would pass [their] way." But the Lord is never afraid of them. In fact, His healing love toward them is so powerful, that the people of the town are ultimately afraid of Jesus! The crowd witnessed His divinity in the way He visited and cared for these men, who we know were not only exorcized of their demons, but were truly saved by their confession: "If you confess with your lips that Jesus is Lord and believe in your heart that God raised Him from the dead, you will be saved."
- Fr. John Kowalczyk, prison chaplain in Pennsylvania for over thirty years, met a man named Ezra in the Mental Health Unit who had lost all sense of reality and was writing expletives on the walls. Fr. John wanted to teach Ezra the Jesus Prayer. They spent months praying together, even holding hands outside of his cell. The Prayer slowly transformed Ezra, as it transforms all of us. Fr. John would tell Ezra over and over, "Christ loves you, and obviously I love you." Now, the prison staff calls Ezra a miracle, who is often seen reading his Orthodox prayer book!


